Abstract Submission Guidelines

The abstract of the paper should be sent in a Word format document; Arial font, size 12-point font, single line, justified margins and should contain a minimum of 250 words and a maximum of 300, with three key words. The document should not exceed half a letter-size sheet.

The title should be centered, written in upper and lower case bold letters, and should not exceed twenty words. It has to be followed by the full name(s) of all authors, without abbreviations, starting with the first name followed by the last name(s). Following this, please provide the full name of the institution of affiliation (if applicable) and the contact e-mail address. The form in which the name appears will be used throughout the organization process and the supporting documents will be issued correspondingly. The rest of the document is the summary of your paper proposal.

Proposals that do not comply with this format will not be considered for evaluation. The Scientific Committee of the X Latin American Colloquium for the Conservation of Industrial Heritage will evaluate the abstracts for oral presentation and will communicate its acceptance or rejection. The mechanism for payment of registration fees for speakers will be announced in a timely manner.

The maximum number of authors per paper is two.

Each speaker will have 20 minutes to present his or her work with the support of PowerPoint material or any other visual resource.

At the end of the presentations there will be a round of questions and answers.

The Organizing Committee of the Congress will award a certificate of participation to the speakers of the Congress, not to the attendees.

1. Challenges and scope for the protection and conservation of tangible and intangible industrial heritage.

The aim is to expose and analyze the various challenges and associated problems that arise locally, nationally and internationally for the conservation and protection of industrial heritage, to present and disseminate successful strategies from the practice of industrial heritage projects, the social, economic and urban effects that the enhancement of these sites has brought about in terms of local development, in order to propose mechanisms that contribute to the protection and safeguarding of this legacy in Latin America and the Caribbean.

2. Memory, cultural heritage and new forms of representation of industrial heritage.

The new debates around industrial heritage and cultural heritage in general emphasize the need to reflect on the social groups that give meaning to heritage, whether tangible or intangible. Collective, historical, cultural and communicative memory connect with those who have had direct experience with the world of work in the factories, the working class

3. Collaborative networks and management models for the safeguarding of industrial heritage.

Because of its complexity, the task of knowledge, protection, conservation and enhancement of the industrial heritage needs interdisciplinary and intersectoral collaborative networks. We are therefore seeking to highlight and explore a variety of examples of work, which may be at an individual, collective or specialized level.

Within each dimension, the following topics may be considered:

- Agribusiness and raw material processing
- Hydroelectric plants and related facilities
- Metallic and non-metallic mining
- Textiles
- Railways
- Maritime
- Roads and means of communication
- Workers' settlements and industrial colonies
- Landscape structure and industrial territories
- Routes, corridors and industrial tourism
- Documentary heritage -written, graphic and digital.
- Documentation, imagery, archives and industrial inventories
- New technologies and virtualization of industrial heritage
- Artistic representations of industrial heritage
- Practices and uses of material heritage, musealization and management of industrial heritage
- Organizations and networks around industrial heritage
